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OVERVIEW

The year 2022 was a remarkable and prolific year for CES as will be evident from the next 30 or so pages. We organized symposia featuring startup leaders, featured regional directors of international development agencies in webinars, published policy papers and arranged roundtables on the dollar crisis that was ongoing, attended CPD's dialog on sustainability reporting as distinguished panelist, to say nothing of the 5 academic papers and 5 white papers we published. Moreover, we made significant inroads with our State Dept funded project. Under this Project, in 2022 alone, CES organized seventeen (17) workshops and seminars reaching over 15,000 people online and offline as we partnered with 5 of the country's top private and public universities to bring the Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) to the campuses of:

- Dhaka University
- North South University
- American International University Bangladesh (AIUB)
- Independent University, Bangladesh
- BRAC University

We are also excited to announce that we have registered a 200% increase in our MOOC sign-ups! CES has also launched its first-ever Diversity Fellowship under this project and to take it a step further, launched a co-curricular club at ULAB called "Kaleidoscope" that aims to create spaces for young people within which they can inculcate knowledge and insights on diversity, tolerance, and pluralism.

We would also like to note that as of time of publication of this newsletter, we currently have 15 Scopus-indexed journal articles, which is a high number not just by Bangladesh standards, but regional and global. This was a year in which our multi-year efforts to increase our Scopusindexed publications began to pay off, and we are very grateful to our leaders and stakeholders for their encouragement and support.


Title: Creating Sustainable Social Change through Diversity and Tolerance



The abstract of the paper states, "In recent years, violent extremism (VE) attacks have escalated worldwide. More schools and students are being attacked. Examining and addressing VE core causes through preventing VE (PVE) strategies can help avoid future atrocities.



Due to the tremendous proliferation of research geared toward PVE, an extensive but disorganized knowledge review has accumulated in recent years. The review aims to discover several common themes and strategies across different disciplines and suggests resilience approaches might be the effective framework for PVE worldwide."

Countries that have been on lockdown for more than three months have partially started to reopen their economies, including Bangladesh. This study conducted 100 expert interviews to identify sectors critical to the reopening of the economy and sectors that carry high transmission risks of the disease."

Mitigating the Dollar Crisis: Policy Recommendations for the Near and Long Term

Over the last few months, the dollar price in Bangladesh has grabbed headlines and generated great discussion. Not unrelated to this, the country is also experiencing an energy crisis due to rising fuel prices and power shortages. A combined effect of the dollar and

fuel crises has led to high rates of inflation and fast depletion of forex reserves. The Government of Bangladesh has already adopted multiple measures to control the dollar price and supplement the forex reserves which includes seeking loans from the IMF, World Bank, and ADB. While many are worried that Bangladesh is headed in the same direction as Sri Lanka and Pakistan, we do not think that the Bangladeshi case is nearly as precarious. The Bangladesh economy is deeper, more complex, and more resilient. This paper provides a thorough analysis of the current situation as well as near and long-term recommendations on how to steer away from future crises.
